Pursuant to the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14, et seq., and N.J.A.C. 5:31-3.1, the following is the Cash Management Plan of the Township of Neptune Sewerage Authority ("Authority") for the calendar year indicated above.

Cash Management and Investment Objectives:

The Township of Neptune Sewerage Authority objectives in this are:

- A. Preservation of capital.
- B. Adequate safekeeping of assets.
- C. Maintenance of liquidity to meet operating needs.
- D. Diversification of the Authority's portfolio to minimize risks associated with individual investments.
- E. Investment of assets in accordance with State and Federal Laws and Regulations.

2. <u>Designation of Official Depositories:</u>

A. The following Governmental Unit Depository Protection Act approved banks are authorized depositories for deposit of funds:

- B. Designated official depositories are required to submit to the Authority a copy of the Governmental Unit Deposit Protection Act Notification of Eligibility, which is filed semi-annually with the Department of Banking each June 30th and December 31st of each year.
- C. Designated official depositories are required to submit to the Authority a copy of the institution's "Annual Report" each year.

3. <u>Designation of Security Broker/Dealers:</u>

A. The following are approved security broker/dealers:

None

4. <u>Cash Management:</u>

- A. All funds shall be deposited within 48 hours of receipt in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.
- B. The Commissioners shall minimize the possibility of idle cash accumulating in accounts by assuring that the amounts in excess of negotiated compensating balances are kept in interest bearing accounts or promptly swept into the investment portfolio.
- C. The method of calculating banking fees and compensating balances shall be reviewed on a monthly basis.
- D. Investment decisions shall be guided by the cash flow projections prepared by the Executive Director.

5. <u>Permissible Investments:</u>

- A. Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the Unites States of America.
- B. Government money market mutual funds.
- C. Any federal savings or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days from the date of purchase, and has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- D. Bonds or other obligations of the local unit or school districts of which the local unit is part.
- E. Insured savings and loan associations and savings bank accounts, not exceeding the amount for which the accounts are insured (\$100,000) or twenty five percent of the total reserves and undivided profits of the association. Such associations must be located within the State of New Jersey.
- F. Certificates of Deposit (CD) issued by banks having their place of business in New Jersey.
- G. Local government investment pools.

- H. Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to Section 1 of P.L. 1977, c. 281 (C.52:18A-90.4).
- I. Repurchase agreements of fully collateralized securities.

6. <u>Authority for Investment Management:</u>

A. The Executive Director of the Authority is authorized and directed to make investments on behalf of the Authority. All investments decisions shall be consistent with this plan and all appropriate regulatory constraints.

7. <u>Safekeeping:</u>

A. Securities purchased on behalf of the Authority shall be delivered electronically or physically to the Authority's custodial bank, which shall maintain custodial and/or safekeeping accounts for such securities on behalf of the Authority.

8. Reporting:

A. The Executive Director shall report to the Board of Commissioners all purchases of investments in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.2.

9. Audit:

A. The Cash Management Plan shall be subject to annual audit conducted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14.

10. <u>Disposition of Abandoned Property:</u>

A. The Commissioners shall escheat to the State of New Jersey checks, which remain outstanding for twelve or more months after the date of issuance.
